



Representative Daniel J. Hunt (13th Suffolk)

For the past nine years, Representative Dan Hunt has served in the Massachusetts House of Representatives, representing the 13th District which comprises several diverse urban coastal neighborhoods in the Dorchester section of the City of Boston. Currently, he serves as Chairman of the House Committee on Human Resources and Employee Engagement.

Last session, Rep. Hunt served as the Chair of the House Committee on Federal Stimulus and Census Oversight. The Committee was responsible for analyzing State and Federal Funding related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Massachusetts received over \$110 billion in federal stimulus funding largely through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act; the Coronavirus Response and Consolidated Appropriations Act (CRCA); and the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).



To put that into perspective, the FY2023 budget will total \$59 billion. Rep. Hunt worked directly with House leadership, Governor Baker's administration, and subject matter experts across the Commonwealth to immediately stabilize our healthcare, housing, and employment sectors, as well as fund job retention and growth in the emerging sectors of the economy.

Rep. Hunt grew up in a family of public service that has spent three generations in Dorchester. His mother, Jean, worked as a nurse practitioner at both Carney Hospital and Massachusetts General Hospital. His father, Jim, has worked in healthcare for more than 40 years focusing on access to care for underserved populations. In a lifetime of activism and service to our communities, Rep. Hunt has learned the importance and rewards of public service. He lives in the city with his wife, Rachel, and their two children, Daniel and June.
